Raised in a poverty-stricken community within Quincy, FL in a single parent household, Charles Gee understood how powerful an education would be not only for his success, but for uplifting as many within his community as possible. Prior to entering law school in 2010, Charles Gee was shot 6 times at an event in Tallahassee, FL. However, he used what seemed to be a potentially fatal setback as an even more purpose driven catalyst for a comeback.

Today, Charles Gee is the managing partner of The Gee & Lee Law Firm based in Tallahassee Florida with his lifelong friend, Adaryll Lee, practicing personal injury with extensive expertise in premise liability, auto accidents, wrongful death, and civil litigation. In less than 7 years since opening their doors in July of 2016, Attorney Gee has provided phenomenal leadership at scale – servicing over 2000 clients while expanding and opening offices in Orlando, Tallahassee and Atlanta, GA. Attorney Gee was also recognized by the FAMU College of Law as the Young Alumni Award recipient in 2017 for his outstanding work in the legal profession in conjunction with his continuous community service efforts. In 2019, Attorney Gee was named the National Bar Association’s “Nation’s Best Advocate” under the age of 40.

Mr. Gee has provided free coding classes to students as well as award students with tech devices to assist with their curiosity, entrepreneurial aspirations - as well as assist with academic studies.

He earned his Juris Doctorate in 2014 from Florida A&M University Law School and his bachelor’s degree in 2009 from Florida A&M University, where he majored in Journalism.
